Letter from the President

For centuries Jews have had the pleasure of discussing, learning, questioning and interpreting what our Torah tells us. What does G-d mean? Does G-d even exist? Why are we responsible for each other? How can we help in a meaningful way? What do the Torah stories mean? Do the lessons apply to me in today's world?

These are very large questions with many different answers that are personal and sacred. Our TBZ community is but a small cog in the grand scheme of the world's big machine. Change is scary, exciting and opens us to opportunities that need participation in order to make us better humans. So it begs the real question: WHY? Why can't things just stay the same? Why do we question what has been written and set before us? Why does this apply to me, and how? Why do I feel a loss of control?

We are not alone in asking these questions. Our tradition tells us that questioning is good and absolutely necessary. As children, we are given morals of stories and pearls of wisdom that may seem non-connected to our daily lives. As we grow, we learn to have the "a-ha" moments when something clicks, makes sense and does help us learn and grow. As adults, we feel the need to teach our children and young communities with the dire hope that what we have said will make a difference as our youth come into their own.

As our team of clergy and lay leadership work for and with this amazing Congregation, we want to answer some of the "Why." If, at any time, you want to know why we meet as a board, why we have congregational town square type of meetings, why we have broken from the old model of Reform congregations...just ask. As we begin with a new board of trustees and new model, we are striving for transparency and focusing on you.

In the old days, the temple community was the social hub of young singles, families, and the steady congregants who hold our history and give us perspective. We want to tell the stories and create new ones for our continuity. From "strength to strength" means being involved, giving opinions, discussing, listening and not letting the past be separated from the present and from the future. We are all busy people. Our schedules make it hard to be present at Shabbat celebrations, events, committee meetings, discussion groups and learning opportunities. The taxi services that we provide our families, for activities, appointments and education opportunities, make it easy to forget our basis for our belief system. We need to give ourselves a break. Schedule personal time, come to Shabbat services to unwind, socialize and reconnect with our Judaism and spirituality. The "Why" may be a perfect focus for re-prioritizing our bigger selves.

Having the responsibility and honor of representing you as your president is not a notch on my belt, an item for my resume; it is my passion. I want know your "Why." What can we do to serve your spiritual, religious, educational and social desires? As I meet with your leadership team and senior team and support staff, your "Why" will lead the conversations. We are responsible for each other, in an awesome and heartfelt way. Let's figure out the "Why" and start the dialogue.
