Letter from the Director of Lifelong Learning

We just celebrated Passover, a holiday filled with memories and meanings. Memories of tedious Seders at my grandparents with the Maxwell House Hagaddah, my first Seder in Israel on a kibbutz, and leading 150 students at a UB Hillel Seder. However, the most meaningful Seder was this one just past. With my family, siblings, cousins and grandchildren, our new engaging and creative traditions will keep Passover meaningful for the next generations.

There is a wonderful Passover story in the Midrash that tells of Nachshon, a leader of the tribe of Judah. He is imagined by the Rabbis to be the first Israelite to step into the Sea of Reeds, even before the waters had parted. The decision to take that first step did not come easily because Nachshon had a fear of water. Through courage, faith and trust in God, he stepped into the sea, kept walking and kept believing. Just when it seemed that he would surely drown, a miracle occurred, and the waters parted.

I don't make decisions easily, whether deciding which birthday card to pick, what color flowers to plant or what clothes to pack for a vacation. I am also not one to make changes easily. So making a decision about a change in my professional life was challenging. Like Nachshon, I have had to learn to listen to my heart and trust what I hear. When I let go of the worry and stress about the unknown, I believe that things will work out.

And so, it is with mixed emotions that I share my decision to step down, after 16 years, from my position as Director of Lifelong Learning. TBZ is the place where I have grown as a Jewish educational professional. I have acquired many wonderful friends and teaching colleagues. I am proud of the accomplishments achieved during my tenure. Most importantly, I am blessed to have had the opportunity to learn with and get to know so many TBZ families, from preschoolers to seniors.

Our tradition teaches that we each have three names – the one we are given, the one we are called and one that is acquired. To this day, the name that I am called the most frequently is "Miss Susan." The one that I have earned is "Learner." I have learned from the children I have taught, from the clergy and teachers I have worked with, as well as from the community members with whom I have shared lifecycles and holidays. And today, I am learning most from my own granddaughter, Liora, my light.

As I leave my current role at TBZ, uncertain of what is next, I am excited about the possibilities, the ones I can't even anticipate. I am not leaving the TBZ community but look to find new ways to learn and grow. Like Nachshon, I found the faith to set aside worry about what's next and to trust that when I put my toe in the water, I will move forward on my lifelong learning journey.

Students Hear Holocaust Survivor

Holocaust Survivor Grigory Shershnevsky spoke on

March 26 to our 7th grade students about his experiences during the war and the life that he built in Western New York. The Shershnevskys are the parents of Rose Berkun, whose children attend the TBZ Religious School.



Grigory Shershnevsky was born in Vilna, Lithuania, shortly before the

German occupation in 1941. He was "adopted" by a Christian Polish woman who also saved a number of other children. His father was active in the underground resistance movement and found Grigory after the war. His mother was presumed murdered by Germans.

The Christian Polish woman who hid him has since been given the Righteous Among the Nations award for hiding Jewish children from the Nazis.

Temple Beth Zion Memories

The Abramovitz/Shahn Sanctuary was unique in architectural and artistic terms, and its dedication was celebrated with new music created by renowned composer Darius Milhaud. Music was also part of the physical fabric of the Sanctuary, and the organ was a centerpiece. Installed in the area in front of the smaller Shahn window by Paul-Guy Servais, this 46-rank organ, opus 2870, was made by prominent organ makers Casavant Frères Limitee of St. Hyacinthe, Quebec, under the tonal director of Lawrence I. Phelps.

Buffalo connections were also part of the creative process. Hans Vigeland of Westminster Presbyterian Church on Delaware Avenue aided in the organ design, and a piece of Buffalo history was incorporated with the addition of trumpets from the Lafayette Theater.



However, HIPPA Privacy Rules often prevent the hospital from sharing that information with us. 
